# "Blessed are those who mourn..."



#### To the leader:

On Sunday, Pastor Bob continued in our Upside Down series where, over the course of several weeks, we are studying the beatitudes or the "blessed are..." statements in Matthew 5. This Sunday, Pastor Bob talked about when Jesus said, "blessed are those who mourn...". This can initially be confusing because mourning doesn't sound like something that we should be quick to do. However, the mourning that Jesus is talking about is having the right perspective of life in this temporary and broken world. It means that you understand that you live as a broken person and endure a broken world, that you love broken people and experience broken relationships and that you're longing for a world that is no longer broken and get to experience the benefits of eternal life with God Himself!
